

## **To All Our Loyal Patrons:**

It has been an unsettling month with the spread of COVID-19 virtually everywhere, seemingly quadrupling the number of patients every week. It seems that as the situation worsens the state and federal government will probably put quarantine in place shortly. The Nassau County Range has closed its doors as of this past weekend. They have not said what their policy will be going forward. Hopefully they will quickly make a decision. Our other private ranges in Brooklyn and Suffolk County have not yet made a decision but will likely do so soon.

New York State Security Guard Administration is considering new protocols to protect the training classroom. Everyone is trying to observe safe procedures that will not create risk for the students or instructor. At Safety Quest, we want to insure a safe and clean environment for training. We are cleaning the classrooms before and after each session, regardless of what was done before at each facility. We ask that all students wash their hands when they arrive for training and when the session is completed. In the classroom we will create a separation that is considered safe for everyone.

Even with these precautions, as of right now, we are not going to accept any new registrations until April 25<sup>th</sup>, 2020. Those registrations that are in place now will be notified of the class status as soon as the facility informs us. If your security license or HR-218 qualification is about to expire and you have to renew immediately (because of work or travel or legal possession of the weapon) please call our Southold office at 631-876-5438 or 5105 and we will work through your particular situation.
